







The European Networks for Private Land Conservation (ENPLC) aims to expand and test the use of private land conservation tools and establish a durable governance structure for private land conservation in Europe. ENPLC is a four-year project financed by the LIFE programme the EU's funding instrument for the environment and climate action. The project aims to:

- expand and test the use of private land conservation tools in the European Union,
- improve the financial incentives and funding for private land conservation,
- compile standards and good practices for private land conservation,
- advance networking among organisations and individuals engaged in private land conservation,
- promote the concept of private land conservation,
- · collect standards and practices for Private Land Conservation,
- hold trainings and workshops.

The project brings together 18 organizations from: Belgium, Czech Republic, Estonia, France, Germany, Italy, Latvia, Portugal, Romania, Spain and The Netherlands.
